

What is Sutter's Iog-a-Thon?

Sutter's eleventh annual Jog-a-Thon will be held November 5th and 6th during Physical Education classes. The Jog-a-Thon is Sutter's biggest school-wide fundraiser of the year. Our school goal is to earn at least \$30,000. This money will boost our student activities fund which pays for things, such as graduation awards, athletic equipment and student planners. If students reach our goal of \$30,000 they will be rewarded with an extra night dance in March!

How do pledges work?

Pledges can be gathered from friends and family members. Pledge sheets will be sent home Friday, October 24th. You have two weeks to gather as many pledges as possible. Take advantage of the two weekends. Call Grandpa, Uncle Joe, Neighbor Nelly, whoever and get TONS of sponsors! Sponsors can pledge a "per lap rate" or a "flat rate."

Example 1: Per Lap Rate

Your mom pledges 50 cents a lap. You run 10 laps. Your mom now owes you (Sutter) \$5.00.

Example 2: Flat Rate

Your mom pledges \$10.00 no matter how many laps you run. If you run 5 or 500 laps, she still owes you (Sutter) \$10.00.



How will the laps be counted?

Sutter's track is 440 yards. For every 220 yards you run, you will be credited with one lap. Markers will be placed on the track to indicate each lap. While you are running, your partner will watch as you pass the 220 yard markers. He or she will make a tally mark for each "lap" you run. At the end of the 25-minute time period, your partner will count all of the tallies and calculate your total laps. A teacher will then calculate the dollars earned for those students with per lap pledges.

How do you collect the money?

You may collect the money at the time you ask for the pledge, have them send it to you, or you can go back to pick it up. Pledges can be paid in cash (preferably) or check.

Checks should be made out to Sutter Middle School.

When do you have to collect the money?

Ideally, all pledges should be gathered and brought to school on Wednesday and Thursday, November 5th and 6th! You can turn your money in to your P.E. teacher or the front office.

At the very latest, you have until Wednesday, November 12th to bring in your money and still receive prizes, be considered for the pizza party and raffle, and/or be named the Top Money earner. You must turn in all of your money to the office by November 12th. Money turned in after the 12th will still be accepted, however, students will not receive prize/credit for it.

Joggy-Jog Prize Breakdown!

Just for running! All participants will receive a popsicle at the end of the run for their efforts.

\$5.00 = Students who bring at least a \$5.00 flat rate or more by November 5_{th} or 6_{th} will receive a Jog-a-Thon t-shirt on the day they run. (Per lap rate pledges will not be considered towards a t-shirt on the first day.) Bring in \$5.00 or more in flat or per lap rates through November 12_{th} to receive a t-shirt (while supplies last).

\$50.00 = Students will receive a Jog-a-Thon t-shirt and a Sutter drawstring shoe bag.

\$100.00 = Students will receive a Jog-a-Thon t-shirt, Sutter drawstring shoe bag, and a Sutter Jog-a-Thon sweatshirt.

\$200.00 and **Up** = Students will receive a Jog-a-Thon t-shirt, Sutter drawstring shoe bag, a Sutter Jog-a-Thon sweatshirt, and an *invitation to the pizza party and raffle for prizes* – pizza, fro-yo, sandwiches, manicures, pedicures, massages, sports tickets, video games and so much more! For every additional \$200 you bring in, you will earn an additional ticket in the raffle that will increase your odds of picking a prize before the rest!

*TOP MONEY EARNERS: This year we are offering 2 top spots –

Top Money Earner 7th grade and Top Money Earner 8th grade. The two top money earners will get first choice at the GRAND PRIZES!

Please go ahead and order your transcript now for West Campus, and Mrs. Fong will put you on her list. On the afternoon of January 30th you will receive your semester transcript, test scores, attendance and behavior reports. West Campus applications will be available on Saturday, Dec. 20, 2014.

Open Enrollment is an opportunity for families that live within SCUSD boundaries to apply for spots in schools beyond their neighborhood school or to apply for enrollment in specialty programs and schools.

SCUSD will be offering two Open Enrollment periods over the next few months: One for students who will be entering middle and high schools next fall and one for students who will be entering an elementary school or a K-8 school next fall.

For convenience, families may apply for Open Enrollment online. The online application for incoming middle and high school students will be available at 8 a.m. January 20 through 5 p.m. on Friday, February 3, 2015.

Dates for the Open Enrollment for incoming elementary students will be posted after the holiday break.

Students choosing to attend a criteria school should visit the school website to determine what application requirements must be met.
